**Section 2. Powers and Functions of the Municipal Price Coordinating Council.**

- A. The MPCC shall have the following powers, duties and functions:
- i. Coordinate the rationalize programs of implementing agencies to stabilize prices and supply at the local level;
  - ii. Recommended to the implementing agencies/ the National Price Coordinating Council (NPCC) suggested retail prices and/or price ceiling;
  - iii. Analyze cause of price fluctuations and steps to correct unwarranted price increases and supply shortages;
  - iv. Coordinate and rationalize programs of member-agencies in the respective provinces, cities and municipalities to stabilize prices and supply of basic necessities and prime commodities;
  - v. To recommend regular inspections of public and private markets, as well as rice warehouses;
  - vi. Activation of Hotlines, Consumers Complaints Desks and Timbangan ng Bayan;
  - vii. Deputation of Barangay Officials and NGOs to monitor abnormal price increases; and
  - viii. Active coordination with other appropriate government agencies to prevent unwarranted price increases and hoarding of rice and other prime commodities
- B. The following implementing agencies of departments of the national government and the Municipality of Tapaz shall have jurisdiction over a basic necessity or prime commodity, which shall be:
1. The Municipal Agricultural and Economic Enterprise Development Office with reference to rice, corn, cooking oil, fresh pork beef and poultry meat, fresh eggs, fresh milk, fresh vegetables root crops, sugar, fresh fruits, dried pork, dried beef and pesticides, herbicides, poultry, swine and cattle, feeds, veterinary products for poultry, swine and cattle.
  2. The rural health office with reference to drugs both classified and not classified as essential by them;
  3. The Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office with reference to firewood, charcoal, plywood, nipa shingles and sawali; and;
  4. The Department of Trade and Industry with reference to canned fish and other marine products, processed milk, coffee, laundry soap and
